

CASTLE VISCONTEO

After long and accurate restoration works, the Castle Visconteo of Legnano, a fortress which construction dates to the XIII century, returned to be open to the public in 2007. The first wing with the rooms renewed and refurnished as exhibition space in addition to Palazzo Leone da Perego was inaugurated in 2006 with the "Goya. I capolavori incisi" exhibition bringing life to a second important cultural pole. Afterwards there were accomplished numerous national and international exhibitions. In 2012 was inaugurated the new permanent exposition place, in the northwest wing of the castle that houses the works of Gaetano Previati "Il Trittico della Battaglia di Legnano" originally placed in the Sutermeister Civic Museum, the sculptures "Angeli" and "Frammenti" by Ugo Riva, and "Le vesti, i tesori e le armi del Palio".
